New Mercies Every Morning

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE (KJV)

Lamentations 3:22-23

"It is of the LORD'S mercies that we are not consumed... They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness."

KEY TRUTH

Every sunrise arrives with fresh evidence of God's mercy and faithfulness.

GOOD MORNING!

Yesterday may have been difficult. Perhaps you ended it disappointed in circumstances, other people, or even yourself. Yet God has allowed you to awaken to a new morning.

His mercy is not leftover grace from yesterday. Scripture says His compassions are new every morning. God meets today's need with today's supply.

Do not drag yesterday's condemnation into the gift of this day. Confess what needs to be confessed, learn what needs to be learned, and receive the mercy God freely gives.

This morning is another opportunity to pray, obey, love, serve, and begin again. Whatever today holds, God's faithfulness arrived before you did.
